Hockessin Library runs a successful teen volunteer program, year round. Over this past summer, 15 volunteers regularly assisted with youth programs. One extraordinary teen, Albert Xing, created and taught a 5 week course in Python to more than 10 regularly enthusiastic students aged teen to adult. After that experience, he shared, "I gained a totally new appreciation for the time and devotion that teachers put into their classes. I am glad to say that it ran smoothly, large thanks to (library programming coordinator) Mrs. Atwood who helped tremendously in coordinating with the library, planning, and advertising. Happy Autumn to all! Summer is done, kids are back in school, and Hockessin Library is the place to be as the months become cooler. We've been hard at work with building improvements. We have new phones, replaced the intercom system and some of the broken shades in the children's room. Thanks also to the Friends, for sponsoring our new easier-to-use magazine shelving.

We have some great programs coming up within the next few months. Our twelve book groups are going strong, and I encourage you to stop in and see what we're reading this month. For our more senior patrons, we've added a popular program, called Matter of Balance, which teaches people how to avoid falls or at least to fall to prevent additional injury. We also have a videogame program for adults to help them get some exercise even though the cold months by playing sports indoors with Wii Fit. For those who are creative, math-inclined or both, we offer a class on creating a binary code necklace (for the little ones) and creating your very own winter-themed necklace (for the adults). We also have two spectacular concerts lined up for December: Vox Humana will be here on December 21 and the First State Bell Ringers return for a holiday concert on December 22. Refreshments will be provided by the Friends.
