That is why the Friends of the Hockessin Library decided to hold a Christmas Used Book sale BEFORE Christmas! The first sale was held last November and was well received. The sale will be held again this year on Saturday November 17th. We will be set up in the Hockessin Library Lobby from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

We have a lot more items than last year, since we have been collecting Holiday books all year long. We have a large selection of children's books, music CDs, DVDs, holiday fiction, cook books, decorating books and some books that include a little of everything Christmas. We even have a few Chanukah and Kwanzaa items. Pricing is comparable to the January Sale prices.

Do you have Holiday books you would like to donate? Please drop them off at the collection shed on Saturday, November 10th from 9:00 a.m. to noon. If you can't make the November collection, you can donate books on the second Saturday of the month year round. The collection shed is located in the gravel lot behind the fire house on Old Lancaster Pike.

Don't despair if you actually do buy Christmas Books in January and you can't make the November sale. All unsold items will be available at the Big Sale January 24th – 27th.

3D PRINTING AT HOCKESSIN

So have you heard about this thing called 3D printing? Folks are using these gadgets to create some marvelous things! And in libraries, people are having a ton of fun learning how to create their own designs and watch the printer bring them to 3D-life. While 3D printers are becoming more popular and have recently dropped in price, there is still a significant time and money investment to set up and use one in your home. The library is a great place to experiment and experience new things — and to see if this might become a passion for you. Hockessin does offer a 3D printing program for those who are interested. Held every 1-2 months, these classes have become a popular way to learn about this free service to our patrons. Once you know how to design a creation, you are welcome to submit a file to be printed. Turn-around time is 1-2 weeks, and you can ask to see your print job being printed if you like. Most files are downloaded from popular sites; however there are several folks who are now designing their own objects in CAD software and submitting them for printing. SUMMER READING PROGRAM FOR ADULTS, 2018: LIBRARIES ROCK!

This year's Summer Reading Program for Adults took the library community on an exciting, amplified musical journey. For the second year in a row all New Castle County libraries offered a coordinated Summer Reading Programs for Adults, using the Beanstack online platform. Hockessin Library made the successful technological transition as adults ably switched from print and used computer devices to track their summer reading with few relying on staff for registration and online participation. Again, Hockessin Library had the highest number of participants, books read, completions, and reviews for adult readers across New Castle County. Hockessin Library rocks!

A total of 90 adults registered for the program, 61 read and logged books, and 52 completed the program by reading/logging four or more books. Hockessin readers logged the most books at 723, and submitted 115 online book reviews (this year book reviews remained an optional feature).

From June 1-August 11, patrons also had the chance of playing Book BINGO, a fun way to promote reading. Ten enthusiastic BINGO players read books from different categories and genres all summer long.

2018 YOUTH SUMMER READING PROGRAM

With the help of the Friends of the Hockessin Library, Summer Reading for youth at the library was a huge success again this year! 498 children and teen participants read 17,581 hours. I hope you all had as much fun as I did Rocking out at the library.

Fall always seems like a great new time to introduce new programs, and this year we are introducing two new programs for kids. We have started a Cooks and Books, Jr. program here at the library for kids aged 5-12, in which we choose a cookbook each month, and each participant makes a recipe from the book. We then come together to discuss what it was like making the recipe, bringing our final products with us to the session so everyone can sample our recipes. We are meeting on the first Sunday of the month at 2 p.m. The cookbook we are currently using can be found on the Children's Desk. We have also brought back Story Time with a Twist on a new night and time. This is a family story time held on Monday evenings at 6:30 p.m. Each week we will read some stories and then do a craft. So put on your PJs, come on in and join us for the fun!

In 2017 we introduced the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten campaign in which parents are asked to read books to babies, toddlers, and preschoolers and log those books on paper or online. We have a small token for each 100 books and then a nice incentive for the 1,000 book goal. This year we are adding the 500 Books before Middle School campaign to our lineup. For this campaign, Kindergarteners- 5th graders are asked to read 500 books before the first day of 6th grade. They too can track their books on paper or online and receive a small token for each 100 books read and a nice incentive when they reach the 500 book goal. Please remember, though: whether you do it at the library or at home, in a box or on a truck, with a parent, child, pet, friend or on your own – for whatever timeframe you choose... the most important thing to do is to always read for pleasure every day!
